### **Editor's note**

Dear Federica, EBCAM has been trying to contact Mr Lanre Akinola with no sucess. Please get in touch via mail or, "a much deeper, faster and more ambitious response is needed" if the world is to meet the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by 2030.

That is the sombre assessment by UN Secretary-General António Guterres in the <u>latest</u> <u>progress report</u> on the 17 goals. <u>Warnings like this</u> have become the norm since the SDGs were adopted to succeed the Millennium Development Goals in 2015 (MDGs).

Disappointing, but not surprising.

The <u>aspirational nature of these goals</u> - including 'zero hunger' and 'no poverty' - is too generic to constitute a practical policy objective, and hard to reconcile with the reality of development progress in regions like sub-Saharan Africa.

Put differently, it should have been obvious in 2015 that the SDGs will mostly be missed.

The causality between having such goals, and incidents where they're actually met, is also dubious - usually boiling down to effective national policies in overachieving countries.

The defense is that global development goals foster cooperation and, if nothing else, provide a target to aim at. But it's questionable whether progress towards achieving things like 'no poverty' would be any different today without the MDGs and SDGs.

It's hard to argue with the motivation behind global development goals, but it can be equally difficult to see what the point of having them is.
