# Collaborative adaptation and mitigation

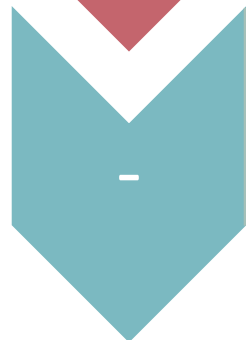

- Climate change leaves Africa with an additional development and financial burden to which it has only contributed very little. In most cases effective and successful adaptation requires investments, e.g. for capacity building
- Hydroponic farms in Southern Africa through rain-water harvesting for farming co-operatives

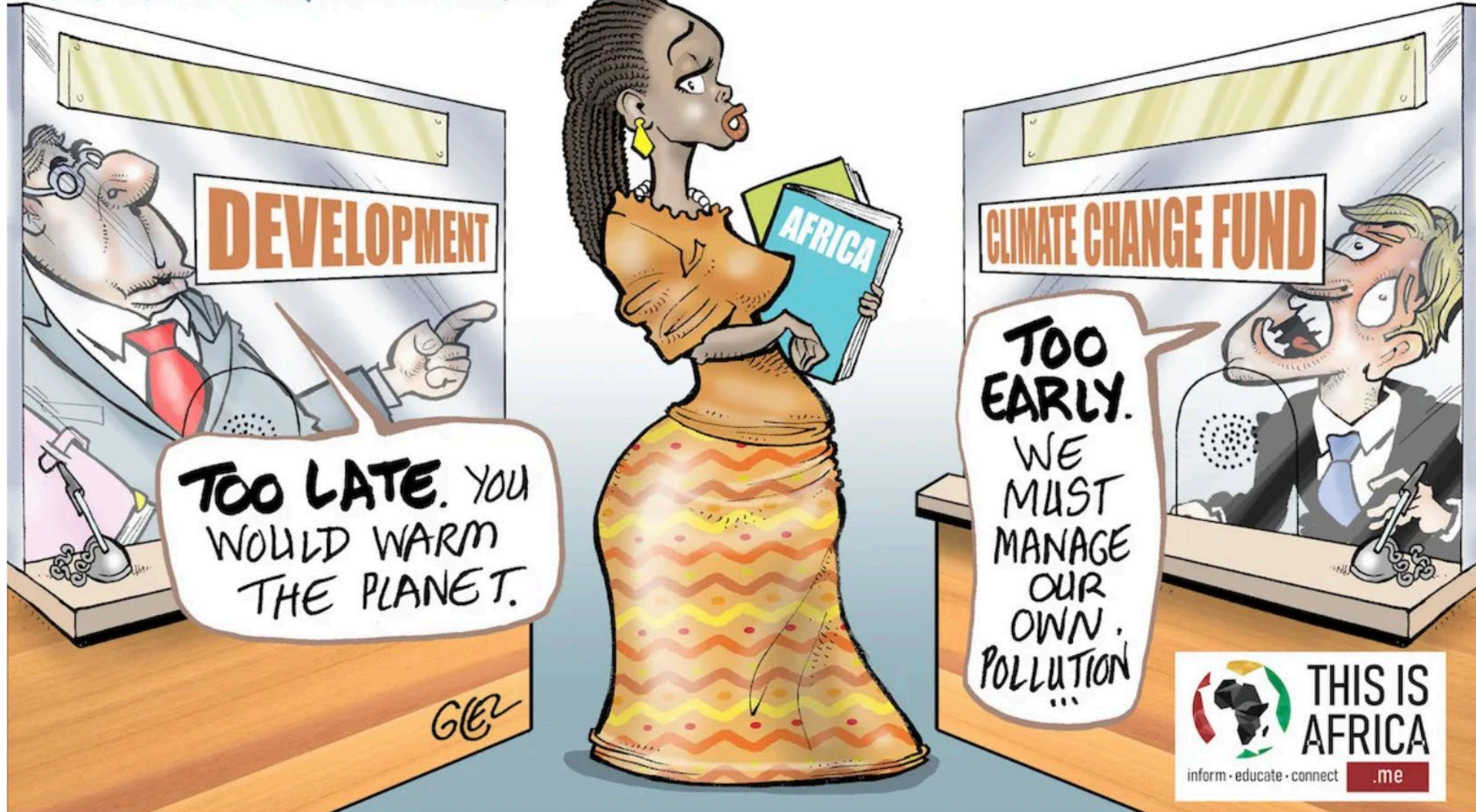


- The European Union is the primary contributor to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change funds that are relevant for adaptation, part of those funds go towards supporting Africa's strategies. However, the available financing is still only a fraction of the adaptation needs the continent requires.
- Policies need to align with development financing objectives



- For Africa the adaptation debate can not be seen isolated from other important development debates. This is especially true since the adaptive capacity of people is significantly affected by their livelihood prospects. This synergy is critical because governance and policies in Africa are now linked with ideas of climate justice and equitable mitigation strategies
